Snapper's boxing clever

PHOTOGRAPHER Mark Kimber is resisting the lure of technology, using old-fashioned methods to create work for his latest exhibition.

Inspired by memories of favourite movies and television shows he watched as a child, Kimber has created

miniature sets and then photographed them using a 1950s, plastic-bodied box camera with film.

Kimber will showcase the photos at the Saint Ignatius' Art Show, part of the South Australian Living Artists (SALA) Festival.

"Each set usually takes me about a week to build, but the photograph can take

weeks to get right because of the tinkering," Kimber, 60, of Glen Osmond, says.

More than 60 artists and more than 500 works of art will be on display and for sale at the art show organised by the college.

The show is at the school's junior campus, Queen St, Norwood, August 7-9.
